

THE COLLECTED REGRETS OF CLOVER is a heartwarming debut about a young woman working as a death doula in New York City who while caring for others at the end of their life has forgotten how to live her own—until the final wishes of a feisty old woman send her on a road trip to uncover a forgotten love story, and perhaps her own happy ending From the day she watched her kindergarten teacher drop dead during a dramatic reading, Clover Brooks has felt a stronger connection with the dying than the iving. After the beloved grandfather who raised her dies by himself while she is traveling, Clover vows that no one else should die alone and becomes a death doula in New York City, dedicating her life to ushering people peacefully through their end-of-life process. Clover keeps three books on her shelves which catalogue her clients' last words: one is labeled ADVICE, one is labeled CONFESSIONS, and the last is labeled REGRETS. But which book would she herself end up in? Clover spends so much time with the dying that she has no life of her own until the final wishes of a feisty old woman send Clover on a trip across the country to uncover an old love story. As she finds herself struggling to navigate the uncharted roads of romance

and friendship, Clover is forced to ask herself: what's the point of knowing how to give someone a beautiful death if you yourself don't even know how to live a beautiful life?

Mikki Brammer is a New York-based magazine writer originally from Tasmania, Australia, whose work has appeared in Architectural Digest, Dwell, Surface, and InStyle. She was raised in part by a flock of 20 quirky great aunts and uncles, many of whom died with great regrets—and sensational secrets. She is at work on her next book. MaTx

A sparkling debut that follows a group of four friends, each alone on Christmas for different reasons. Hannah and Finn meet in as the only two people left on campus on Christmas. Her, because her parents died when she was a teenager; him, because his conservative family rejected him after he came out as gay. One magical evening together sparks a tradition that follows them into their adult lives in New York City. Along the way, their group swells from two to four as they welcome Priya (Hannah's fashionista roommate) and Theo (a mysterious and fabulously wealthy British cad) to their ranks.

GINA MARÍA BALIBRERA | THE VOLCANO DAUGHTERS (HISTORICAL) (TRELLIS)



This is a fierce and furious literary debut about two sisters raised in 1930s El Salvador under the thumb of a brutal dictator and their flight from genocide

THE VOLCANO DAUGHTERS follows two sisters through and beyond La Matanza, the 1932 massacre that killed 30,000 citizens of El Salvador.

Graciela is raised in the Izalco volcanos, dusty-kneed and bound closely to her friends, until a messenger from the Capital comes to claim her: at nine years old she has been selected to work as a rising dictator's oracle, a muse to help foresee the future of El Salvador. In the Capital, far from her mother and friends, she meets Consuelo, the sister she's never known. Consuelo is willful, talented and desirous, and the sisters are a small fortress within the dictator's regime. But they are no match for the cruelty of El Gran Pendejo—and in the aftermath of La Matanza they barely escape, each believing the other to be dead, fleeing to California, Paris, and beyond.

Narrated by a raucous, poignant, ferociously funny chorus of the dead, THE VOLCANO DAUGHTERS carves out a new space beside Ingrid Rojas Contrera's Fruit of the Drunken Tree and Valeria Luiselli's Lost Children Archive, with nods to George Saunders' Lincoln in the Bardo in its ghostly

narrative, and to the Popul Vuh, the sacred text of the Mayan creation mythologies.

Gina María Balibrera earned her MFA from the University of Michigan Helen Zell Writers' Program. A founding fiction editor of The Offing, she received the Under the Volcano Sandra Cisneros Fellowship in 2020, and her short fiction

was selected by Min Jin Lee for the Aura Estrada Prize. An excerpt of THE VOLCANO DAUGHTERS was selected by Leticia Hernández Linares, Rubén Martínez, and Héctor Tobar, to appear in The Wandering Song, an anthology of writing of the Central American diaspora. MaTx

Set in WWII-era Malaysia, it's a family saga wrapped in a propulsive espionage plot—a taut, breathtaking story of inherited pain, colonization, and the unfathomable reverberations of the choices we are forced to make in times of darkness. Bintang Estate, Malaya, 1945. Cecily Alcantara's family is in terrible danger: her 15-year-old son has disappeared, her eldest

daughter grows angrier by the day, and her youngest is confined to the basement, lest she be pressed into comfort stations for the Japanese soldiers. Cecily is certain of just two things: that this is all her fault, and that her family must never know why. A decade prior, Cecily had been desperate for a bigger life in Britishcolonized Malaya. Told from four unforgettable perspectives—Cecily's and each of her three children—THE STORM WE MADE is about more than the horrors of war; it's about the fraught relationships between the colonized and their oppressors and the loneliness of a life split in half. Vanessa Chan is a Malaysian writer whose short fiction has been most recently published in the Kenyon Review and has received nominations for the Pushcart Prize. She has been awarded fellowships from the Sewanee Writers' Conference, Tin House, Bread Loaf Writers' Conference, and others. She grew up in Malaysia, studied for her MFA at The New School, and is now based in Brooklyn. MaTx

JESSICA BULL | MISS AUSTEN INTESTIGATES: THE HAPLESS MILLINER (COZY CRIME, HISTORICAL) (MUSHENS)



Hampshire, 1795: A young Jane Austen is plotting to secure a marriage proposal from Tom Lefroy when she uncovers the body of a murdered woman. After her beloved brother, Georgie, is implicated in the crime, Jane has six weeks to expose the real killer, or Georgie will face the gallows.

Jane Austen – witty, spirited, and incredibly clever – is suddenly thrust into a mystery when a milliner's dead body is found locked inside a cupboard in the middle of a ball. When Jane's brother Georgie is found with some jewellery belonging to the deceased, the local officials see it as an open and shut case: one which is likely to end with his death. Jane is certain that he is innocent, and there is more to the murder than meets the eye. Her investigations send her on a journey through local society, as Jane's suspect list keeps on growing – and her keen observational skills of people will be put to the test to solve the crime and save her brother.

Jessica Bull grew up in South East London, where she still lives with her husband, two daughters, and far too many pets. She's addicted to stories and studied English Literature at Bristol University, and Information Science at City University, London. She began work as a librarian (under the false impression she could sit and read all day), before becoming a communications consultant. HANNAH DEITCH | KILLER POTENTIAL (THRILLER) (TRELLIS)



KILLER POTENTIAL is like a class-conscious Thelma & Louise by way of Gillian Flynn, following two unlikely fugitives: an SAT tutor who finds her rich employers brutally murdered in their backyard, and the mute woman she discovers trapped in the walls of their mansion.

Evie Duarte is drowning in student loan debt, teaching algebra to the spawn of Beverly Hills, when she becomes a famous murderess. The press anoint her the new Charles Manson, a bloodthirsty ninety-nine percenter hoping to spark a class war.

The problem is that Evie didn't kill anybody. She was simply in the wrong mansion at the wrong time.

When Evie arrives at Serena Victor's modern-day castle one Sunday for their weekly session, she finds, in lieu of a bored teenager, the bloody remains of Serena's parents in their beautiful backyard. Before she can call for help, another secret reveals itself: a silent woman, bound within the walls of the Victors' estate. As Evie works to free the woman, they're spotted. In moments, they go from bystanders to suspects to fugitives.

Suddenly at the heart of a nationwide manhunt, accompanied by this mysterious hostage who refuses to speak, Evie spirals. The only way to clear their names is to find the real killer, to unravel the sordid truth of the Victors' house and their impossible wealth. But first she'll have to break down the barriers of her new companion—who is traumatized, unknowable, and yet somehow, quickly becoming the most important person in Evie's upside-down life.

KILLER POTENTIAL is a truly rare gem: a crackling, phenomenally-written page-turner with the emotional clarity of the best literary fiction. At its core is an interrogation of income disparity and the horrors of late-stage capitalism, the potential for love in the midst of crisis, and the impossible myth of upward mobility.





When war is declared, June tries desperately to shield the Avallon from it, but it's for naught when E.D. Gilfoyle makes a deal with the State Department to house dozens of Axis diplomats, engineers, businessmen and journalists at the hotel. The goal is reciprocity; the detainees are meant to live in absolute luxury in the hope that Allied VIPs trapped overseas receive the same care. June must convince her staff—many of whom have sons and husbands heading to battle—to feed Nazis caviar for the war effort. Peacefully.

Another factor threatens the Avallon's careful tranquility: an FBI agent, Tucker Minnick, is searching for a spy among the detainees. Although he has not returned to West Virginia in years, he has his own history with the sweetwater. He would have done anything to avoid returning to those mountains, to those springs, but this mission is an exile that he deserves and won't escape unless he earns it. He doesn't expect to have a change of heart about the hotel. He also doesn't expect to fall in love.

As tension grows between locals and the detainees and Tucker's spy games disturb the peace at the Avallon, June starts to lose control. She spent her adolescence tangled up with the Gilfoyle family, and thought she'd made her peace with them, but the hurt and broken promises are bubbling to the surface.

Her future with the Avallon relies on her keeping things tranquil at all costs. That's beginning to look like too dear a price. But who is she without the hotel? And what is it without her?

Maggie Stiefvater is the #1 New York Times best-selling author of The Raven Cycle, the Shiver trilogy, and other novels for young and adult readers. 





May Sarton is the pen name of Eleanore Marie Sarton (May 3, 1912 – July 16, 1995), an American poet, novelist, and memoirist. She went to school in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and started theatre lessons in her late teens. In 1945 she met her partner for the next thirteen years, Judy Matlack, in Santa Fe, New Mexico. They separated in 1956, when Sarton's father died and Sarton moved to Nelson, New Hampshire. Honey in the Hive (1988) is about their relationship. Sarton later moved to York, Maine. She died of breast cancer on July 16, 1995. She is buried in Nelson, New Hampshire. MòMa

Weaving together strands of psychology, law, sociology, trauma studies, and, above all, the testimonies of survivors who Dr. Herman has interviewed, Truth and Repair will begin to offer much-needed answers, arguing that we must reconsider our notion of justice, and the systems we use to mete it out, by learning from survivors. Justice that doesn't center the survivor is deficient. It may not even be justice at all. Part manifesto and part searching exploration, Truth and Repair will merge two important cultural movements at exactly the right time: our resurgent interest in trauma (typified by the mega-bestselling, The Body Keeps the Score, by Dr. Herman's old friend and colleague Bessel van der Kolk) and our ongoing reckoning with #MeToo and sexual violence (Know My Name, No Visible Bruises, Is Rape a Crime?).

Dr. Judith Herman is a Professor of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School and the co-founder of the Victims of Violence Program at The Cambridge Hospital, Cambridge, MA, where for thirty years, until she retired, she was Director of Training. She is the author of two award-winning books: Father-Daughter Incest (Harvard University Press, 1981) and Trauma and Recovery (Basic Books, 1992). Father-Daughter Incest, one of the first works to address the subject, has


been translated into Japanese and Korean and went into a second edition in 2000. Trauma and Recovery has been translated into Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Farsi, Hebrew, Turkish, Greek, Italian, Spanish, Danish, Swedish, Dutch, German, Hungarian, Slovak, Lithuanian, Croatian, Serbian, Bosnian, Ukrainian, and Russian. 




